# All About Creating Contrast in the Kitchen

As 2022 comes to an end, so does the ultra-matchy kitchen trend. The all-white kitchen is on its way out. Instead, we are seeing a trend towards combining design elements and textures to create a more interesting and appealing space in your home.

Not quite sure how this works? Well, the great thing is that nothing is off limits - here are some ideas:

## Combine Styles

You don't have to decide on one design theme like "modern" or "farmhouse." Instead, you can combine styles to create a space that is unique to you. For example, we like combining sleek, modern cabinets and counters with antique-style lighting and door handles.



## Pair Unlikely Textures and Materials

Does a rustic natural wood countertop and a glamorous marble tiled backsplash sound like a combination that would work? Surprisingly, it does. The new kitchen trend brings together materials that are not an obvious pairing to create an exciting and eye-appealing space.

Another example could be using natural stone flooring, which is usually seen in a traditional style kitchen, with sleek black cabinets and metal countertops that would be considered more modern.

Combining different wood tones is also a great way to incorporate this trend into your kitchen. You could have dark hardwood floors paired with light wood, like oak, for your cabinets. This used to be a "no-no" in design, but not anymore!

## Throw The Color Wheel Out The Window

What's so fun about this home design trend is that the old design rules don't have to be followed. You can and should use colors that don't typically work together – the key is in the shade and the types of materials you use.



It's okay to have a light shade of gray for the cabinets with a bold orange and bright blue backsplash. You can use blacks and browns together. If you wanted to, you could even have lime green cabinets with lavender floral wallpaper on an accent wall – we could make it work!

## Pay Extra Attention to The Finishes

For this trend to work, you need to pay close attention to the finishes. It used to be that all the finishes had to be one color or material, but with this trend, that's frowned upon.

You can have a bronze-colored kitchen sink that matches your door pulls, but then have your faucet be a completely different material like chrome. The materials you use will complement the rest of the kitchen and tie the entire look together.

## The Front Door

Using metal will be a great option if you need to replace your siding. Metal works great on the roof, too, and would look great with the wood and stone pairing.

# New & Unusual Finishing Touches for the Kitchen

## Range Hood
